## **The World Day of Migrants and Refugees – Sunday 27 September 2020**

The Church has been celebrating the World Day of Migrants and Refugees (WDMR) since 1914. It is always an occasion to express concern for different vulnerable people on the move; to pray for them as they face many challenges; and to increase awareness about the opportunities that migration offers.

The theme chosen by the Holy Father for the 106th World Day of Migrants and Refugees is **"Forced like Jesus Christ to flee"**.

In his message the Holy Father says: *"Displaced people offer us this opportunity to meet the Lord, 'even though our eyes find it hard to recognize him: his clothing in tatters, his feet dirty, his face disfigured, his body wounded, his tongue unable to speak our language' (Homily, 15 February 2019).*

We are called to respond to this pastoral challenge with the four verbs I indicated in my Message for this Day in 2018: welcome, protect, promote and integrate.
